DARE TO BELIEVE ANNUAL REPORT 2022

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A MESSAGE FROM

The **Dare to Believe Olympic Schools Programme** has had another very successful year in 2022. We kicked off the year with the Road to Beijing Olympic School Challenge which saw 22,000 kids engage in the physical and cultural activity challenge to coincide with the Winter Olympics. Furthermore, we had our first online webinar that reached over 5000 children for a Q&A with two Winter Olympians Live from the Olympic Village in Beijing.

In March, we on-boarded 14 new ambassadors bringing our total ambassador count to 28 athletes. The new athletes included superstars Olympic medallists **Eimear Lambe** and **Aifric Keogh** along with Olympic and Paralympic athletes from 9 different sports.

In May, we announced **permanent tsb** as our title sponsor and launched our new interdisciplinary Olympic Values Transition Year Programme. We had hundreds of secondary school teachers register and we hosted a webinar for prospective teachers. The new programme release coincided with the launch of new website that hosts all of our programme resources.

Our core primary programme ran throughout the Spring term and included **50 ambassador visits** who engaged with approximately 3,000 students. We also ran 4 promotional visits and during these special visits, schools were gifted needed sports equipment.

The Autumn term of Dare to Believe Ambassador visits were booked up in under 15 minutes on our new custom visit management platform. The 50 visits included the happy return of ambassadors going back into schools to the delight of students and ambassadors alike. This term also included the first of our **Transition Year visits** which were also overwhelmingly positive for all involved.

Other highlights from the term was the involvement of Dare to Believe in the **Transition Year Expo** at the Sport Ireland Campus where 4000+ students attended and got to engage with our ambassadors through Olympic Sports demonstrations, panel discussions and talks.

One new offering we are delighted to have added for our Olympic Education Community was the **Olympians Live! Webinar** with Olympic medallists Aifric Keogh and Eimear Lambe. We had approximately 12,000 students join the primary and secondary webinars.

The Dare to Believe team of Roisin McGettigan-Dumas OLY and Roisin Jones were honoured to be asked to join a select group of Olympic Education programmes from around the world at the IOC HQ. Later in the Autumn Roisin McGettigan-Dumas OLY was invited back to become a new member of the IOC's Educational Commission.

We want to thank everyone involved in helping the Dare to Believe Olympic Schools Programme to deliver an incredibly successful 2022 year.

We especially are thankful to our super star ambassadors, teacher consultants, sponsors Permanent TSB and the IOC Olympic Solidarity Funding which makes this programme possible in Ireland.

This report aims to highlight the key activities and milestones achieved during this year for the Dare to Believe Olympic Schools Prorgramme with also an update on key priorities for 2023.

CREATION AND OPERATION OF THE FIRST WINTER OLYMPIC CHALLENGE "ROAD TO BEIJING"



ROAD TO BEIJING

CONCEPT OVERVIEW

The 2021 Winter Olympics were held in Beijing from February 4th 2022 until February 20th 2022. We sought to create awareness of the Winter Olympics and snow sports with school aged pupils in Ireland. In a similar vein to the "Road to Tokyo" Schools challenge we aimed to create a virtual physical and cultural challenge over 2 weeks which encouraged schools to get active and learn more about the Winter Olympics.

A key positive about this initiative is that it helps address the low activity levels of children in Ireland (identified in the National Health and Physical Activity plan). So by getting an hour a day which we are encouraging kids to do it will help reverse this statistic and achieve the WHO recommendation of 60 mins of activity per day.

HOW IT WORKED

School teams logged their physical activity which was converted to a distance on their virtual journey to Beijing. There were four stops on the interactive road where students unlocked new activities, whilst also learning all about Beijing and the Winter Olympics.

Activity included games on the school yard, PE, sports and activity at home. We provided Winter Sports and Chinese themed physical education resources at each stop. We were delighted to include adaptations for the PE games for students with disabilities using the tree model. The TREE model is one of a few widely used adaptation models that serve as memory tools to help consider different aspects of a physical activity to facilitate inclusion of students with disabilities.

SECONDARY SCHOOL

In April 2022, we expanded our Dare to Believe programme offering by launching our new TY post primary school programme, After developing and testing the programme for over a year, we were thrilled that 383 secondary schools teachers immediately registered for the programme.

The TY programme includes a 6 unitcurriculum that is based on the Olympic & Paralympic Values and is coupled with an Olympic Ambassador visit.

- the positive impact of sport on society as a whole
- it's role in the sustainable development goals
- personal well-being and motivation

- important topics such as respect, equality and online harassment.

The curriculum encourages dialogue around key subjects such as **mental health**, **racism**, **psychology** and **sociology** in an age appropriate and relevant way.

We provide all the resources teachers and students need for the classroom based programme: online presentations, printable teacher worksheets and student worksheets for no cost.

Autumn 2022 saw the first cohort of schools rolling out the programme and it is currently being taught by PE teachers, Guidance Counsellors and by other teachers looking for something different for their TY students. Our ambassadors have enjoyed working with this older population and teachers are reporting that students are enjoying the programme and visits.

CORE PROGRAMME AND

OVERVIEW

The Dare to Believe Olympic Schools Core Programme aims to inspire and increase youth participation in sports, by maximising our Olympic athletes roles as ambassadors.

This core programmes are aimed at 5th/6th class primary schools children (aged approx 10-12 years) and now also TY students (aged approx 15-16 years old). This is done through inspirational workshops by Olympic and Paralympic ambassadors going in schools across Ireland, where the ambassadors will share their own individual stories of dedication, resilience and determination.

In addition to the visit, schools receive a 5 Module Resource pack that teachers work through with students to introduce Olympism and teach students about Olympic values. These 5 Olympic Modules will prepare the school for the Olympic ambassador's visit with the aims of leaving a lasting impact on students. All schools that complete the 5 Ring module will receive an Irish Olympic Flag. Primary schools receive physical copies of the resources whereas the TY/secondary school resources are hosted on our website and include presentations, teacher and student worksheets. The core programme curriculum was co-created with teacher's input and help teachers cover.

RESULTS

We set ourselves a goal of conducting 100 visits per school year. The Spring term were mainly still remote virtual visits but by the Autumn athletes and students alike were delighted to be able to go back in-person and we had over 50% of our visits in-person. We will be keeping the virtual visits too because they have been well received and they allow us to engage internationally based Olympians and also they allow us to reach schools all over the country.

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OLYMPIANS LIVE!

Due to the high demand on ambassador visits that far exceeds our budgetary capacity to give everyone a visit, we decided to run an Olympians Live! webinar to let students from all over Ireland join two of Ireland's biggest sport stars, Olympic bronze medallists from the Tokyo Olympics, rowers Aifric Keogh and Eimear Lambe.

On Wednesday, November 16th, we hosted their first official Olympians Live! nationwide webinar event for both primary and secondary schools. Over 12,000 students tuned in from all over the country to meet Airfic and Eimear. The two 30minute shows were hosted by TV personality and activist Emer O'Neill and they welcomed students from six schools ask the Olympians questions live.

Reviews of the webinar reported that students loved having live access and interaction with the medallists; learning about the athletes lives, training routines (they can weight lift the equivalent of a panda!!), the importance of teamwork, information about the sport of rowing and how they came back from injury and defeat. The rowers were described as inspirational!
